How Are We Doing at Being Church?

This is the question our district superintendent, Tim Overton-Harris will be asking us on Sunday, November 18. Tim will join us for worship where we will celebrate Consecration Sunday, and following worship, we will fellowship together around a delicious lunch. Please plan to join us for lunch and stay after to help with the assessment of our church.

While we often keep doing the same things we've been doing for years, the world around us has changed. So, to be the chief missional strategist for our district, Tim plans to visit each local church to assess where it is at in its ministry and mission, and what it brings to the work of partnering with God and Christ in transforming lives and the world. That is where you come in on November 18.

Tim will take us through a process described in the Discipline for this assessment work. Here is that process in part:

¶ 213. A Process for Assessment of Local Church Potential—Since every congregation is located in a community in some type of transition, every local church is encouraged to study their congregation's potential... 1. This study shall include, but not be limited to:

a) unique missional opportunities and needs of the community;

b) present ministries of the congregation;

c) number of leaders and style of leadership;

d) growth potential of the surrounding community;

e) fiscal and facilities needs;

f) distance from other United Methodist churches;

g) number and size of churches of other denominations in the community;

h) other items that may impact the church's ability to fulfill the mission of the church as stated in Chapter One, Section I.

Every congregation and its leadership should begin its own assessment process. What assets do we have? People, financial, property, connections, relationships with other organizations, etc.? Who is it that lives in the immediate area of our church building? What shops, stores, and business populate our community? What do the people who are our neighbors need? How can we partner with them and other organizations and churches to meet these needs? These are the questions to begin asking, but Tim reminds us that to get the answers, we will need to step out of our church doors and into the neighborhood and develop relationships.


In December the United Methodist Women will be collecting toiletries for the Christmas boxes. Remember to put this special project on your calendar.

Book Study Group

Our November book is "Wolf Winter" by Cecilia Ekbäck. Swedish Lapland, 1717. Maija, her husband Paavo and her daughters Frederika and Dorotea arrive from their native Finland, hoping to forget the traumas of their past and put down new roots in this harsh but beautiful land. Above them looms Blackåsen, a mountain whose foreboding presence looms over the valley and whose dark history seems to haunt the lives of those who live in its shadow. While herding the

family's goats on the mountain, their daughter Frederika happens upon the mutilated body of one of their neighbors, Eriksson. The death is dismissed as a wolf attack, but Maija feels certain that the wounds could only have been inflicted by another man. She is compelled to investigate despite her neighbors' strange disinterest in the death and the fate of Eriksson's widow.

Our next book is "The Golden Ring: A Christmas Story" by John Snyder. It is just days before the Christmas of 1918 in a picturesque township nestled in the mountains of coal country. Anna Beal, an idealistic nine-year-old, is very close with her father Joseph, a hardworking railroad engineer. As Christmas approaches, a series of puzzling dreams shared by Joseph and Anna about a golden ring mystifies them both. Based on a true story. It doesn't look like this book is on Kindle. 
